Eagle School Course Offerings Public Courses

How to ride a bicycle This course is meant to take a person of any age from 3 years old and up and teach them how to balance and ride on a two wheeled bicycle. Riders are accepted for this course depending on their maturity level.

Length: per hour as needed

Price per student: \$35.00 per hour with a \$10.00
Minimum

Kids I Is taught to the Parents of children who are starting to ride who want to know how to guide their young riders.

Length: 1 or 3 hours

Price: Free

Kids II is taught to children about 10 to 12 years old and is meant to give a basic understanding of the responsibility of road users and bicyclists in particular. This course is NOT like a bike rodeo. The students are taught all of the basic skills a bicycle rider must know to start using a bicycle safely and they are drilled until they show competency. The course includes a test at the end. Examples of some of the things the students learn are:

- Helmet use and care
- Bike maintenance
- Basic bike skills such as getting on and off and mounting the bike to ride
- Basic handling skills such as riding in a straight line, balancing with control and scanning behind for cars without swerving
- Exiting a driveway
- Hand signals and communication with other drivers
- Road position for both riding straight and turning
- Many more skills that could best be described as defensive driving

Length: 10 hours

Price per student: \$100.00 Group or school discounts available

TS 101 Is an adults class that is meant for riders who already drive or ride and want to learn how to ride in the safest, most efficient manner possible. It is equivalent to 8 years of riding experience under all possible riding conditions.

Length: 9 hours

Price per student: \$90.00

TS 201 Takes up where Road I leaves off or is meant for riders who already have many years of experience. Taking both Road I and Road II courses is the equivalent of 15 years of riding experience under every kind of weather, temperature and traffic extreme.

Length: 12 hours

Price per student: \$ 100.00

Commuting Teaches you how to use the most efficient, most convenient and least expensive form of transportation ever invented to go to work, the grocery store and anywhere else you want to take it.

Length: 3 hours

Price: Free with Road I or \$60.00 later per student

Mechanics Classes Are available as either a "learn by the hour" or how to do a specific task

Safe Routes To School

Safe Routes To School Bicycle Course Teach the Safe Routes to school course.

Length: 9 hours

Price: \$1,000 per week with an 18 week minimum.

Safe Routes To School Walking Course This course is the yet to be released walking module that is taught to 7 to 13 year old students. This course includes a module on environmental awareness along with walking safety.

Length: 3 hours

The courses below are not national courses.

Set up Safe Routes To School Course This is where I go into a school system and set up the school system from scratch in teaching a Safe Routes To School Walking and or Bicycling course. My experience in setting up my own program can help you get up and running as fast as possible with fewer errors during the process.

Length: Varies

Price: \$5,000.00 plus reasonable expenses

Partial Day Course This course offers the information that allows local officials to decide if Safe Routes to school makes sense for their community. The modules include teaching a variation of the "Why Safe Routes to School Matters" module and showing the video. This is an upbeat informational course meant to fire a community up about getting a Safe Routes to School program started.

Length: Approx 1 to 2 hrs.

Price: \$800.00 per group plus reasonable expenses

Full Day Course This course is meant to teach a local community about how to start up their own Safe Routes to School program and learn how to evaluate it to keep it going. This inclusive course involves teaching the complete set of one day modules. These modules can change as needed by a community:

Welcome, introductions and visioning exercise, Setting the context: Safety, health and transportation, Engineering strategies, Enforcement strategies, Education and encouragement techniques, How communities are making it happen, Field exercise at school: Observation of school environment, Identifying problems and solutions, Making it happen here

Length: 7 to 8 hours

Price: \$2,500.00 per group plus reasonable expenses

Full Day Course with Coordinator Duties This involves working as a coordinator with a local community as well as instructing the One Day Course.

Length: Varies

Price: Actual time plus reasonable expenses in addition to the above Course fee.

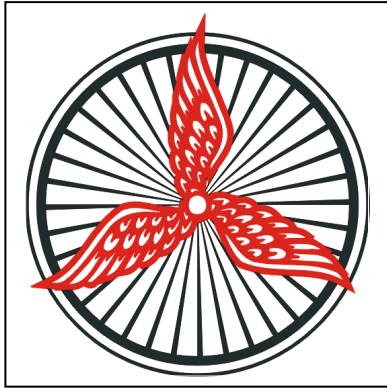
